The agricultural sector releases the largest volume of toxic chemicals into the environment, polluting billions of hectares of land, and driving unacceptable biodiversity, climate, human rights, and health harms.

Major pesticides risk reductions and significantly increased use of agroecological approaches were enshrined in the CBD's landmark Global Biodiversity Framework.

ICCM and SAICM Beyond 2020 must reflect these commitments, now.

Expert panellists representing dozens of governments, hundreds of CSOs, and millions of farmers will outline why key Targets of SAICM Beyond 2020 (A5, A7, D5), the proposed Global Alliance on HHPs, and commitments on Issues of Concern (IoCs) are essential if ICCM is to remain credible as a policy forum that addresses the role of pollution as the third planetary crisis.
